I am excited to be running for a Virginia delegate position for 2022. My career has been shaped by my participation in our APTA and VPTA organizations. Serving in our professional organization has and continues to enrich my career. I graduated from East Carolina University in 1983 with a BS in physical therapy and in 2007 I completed my transitional DPT from Simmons College in Boston.

My employment began as a staff therapist for Sheltering Arms Rehab Hospital. I had the opportunity to work as a PT in a variety of venues during my tenure there including acute care, outpatient and inpatient rehab.
